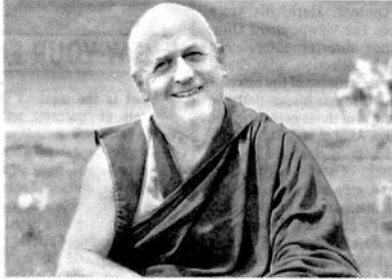

'Anyone can be the happiest person'

The happiest man in the world does not own a house or car, or earn any money, and he spends three months each winter alone in a tiny Nepalese hermitage without home comforts or even any heating. Matthieu Ricard does, however, carry in his simple fabric bag a laptop in a padded case.

Mr. Ricard is a molecular biologist turned Buddhist monk who for almost, a decade, has enjoyed (or laboured under) the title of the most content human on the planet.

Neuro-research

A little embarrassed by the "happiest man" title, he says it was first coined in a British newspaper headline, and calls it a total exaggeration. But it does reflect the result of a striking piece of research published by neuroscientists in the 1990s which found that, while undergoing meditation, Mr. Ricard's brain showed a degree of stimulation in areas associated with positive emotions and impulses that was previously unrecorded in scientific literature.

Meditating for a long period of time, the University of Wisconsin research suggest-

ed, had the potential capacity to alter the brain, a finding which was interpreted more widely as an ability to train oneself in happiness. He has, at the moment, abandoned his mountain top to tour the world. He has been talking about a new book on altruism, and an app designed to teach meditation.

The obvious question to be asked of Mr. Ricard is what there is to be so happy about when a devastating earthquake in Nepal has led to the deaths of thousands. Because evolution, he says, has equipped us to focus on danger and drama "we have this

overwhelming feeling of this wicked world". He adds: "The banality of goodness is overlooked. Of course there was a moment [after the earthquake] when everyone ran for their life. But immediately afterwards, there was calm, discipline, helping. They do it in solidarity."

He insists he sees signs of the perfectibility of humanity everywhere, claiming that globally violence rates are falling, signs of grassroots solidarity are everywhere. There is, he argues, something in the air.

He is, by training and instinct a scientist, having be-

gun studying Buddhism in the late 1960s at the same time as he was completing a PhD at the Pasteur Institute, in Paris. "It wasn't like slamming any doors," he says, "it is that you cross a mountain pass and the next valley is so beautiful you want to settle there."

He chooses to participate in studies on meditation to back up his thesis that altruism can make humans better people, and in so doing can nudge society, bit by bit, towards something better.

Meanwhile, he says, ongoing neurological studies suggest that you do not need to own a pair of sandals and have a Himalayan view to develop your capacity for positivity and compassion. Four weeks of "caring mindfulness" meditation for 20 minutes a day was also shown to alter the brain and enhance the immune system, he says. The lesson? "Anyone can be the happiest man or woman in the world if you look for happiness in the right place." — © Guardian Newspapers Limited, 2015

300 children who underwent cleft lip surgery take out rally



SPREADING THE SMILE: Free cleft lip surgeries are performed in hospitals in 72 countries

Madurai: Children who had undergone cleft lip surgeries at the Meenakshi Mission Hospital and Research Centre took out a rally from the hospital to Mattuthavani bus stand on Thursday to create awareness on the benefits of this free surgery.

The hospital, in co-ordination with the NGO The Smile Train has performed 9,500 successful cleft lip and cleft palate surgeries since 2003. Senior consultant plastic surgeon Dr N Panchavarnam, who had performed all these surgeries, said, "We are among the top ten centres that conduct the largest number of free cleft lip and palate surgeries."

The hospital has conducted free medical camps in villages in various districts of Tamil Nadu to create awareness and has planned to touch the 10,000 mark by the end of 2015. Patients coming for the free surgeries, predominantly children, are given free food, accommodation, speech therapy and counselling. Medicines are also given free of cost.

Free cleft lip surgeries are performed in hospitals in 72 countries and anybody, adult or child, is welcome to approach the hospital and get it corrected. Additional collector Rohini Ramdoss flagged off the rally, in which about 300 children participated.

Copters may be used as ambulances

THIRUVANANTHAPURAM: The government is planning to use helicopters to transport organs for emergency transplants and to shift those critically injured in road accidents to hospitals.

Disclosing this to mediapersons at the police headquarters here on Saturday, Home Minister Ramesh Chennithala said a meeting to work out related modalities would be convened on July 1 with Health Minister V.S. Sivakumar.

The Home Minister said all the 19 police districts would be provided with a police ambulance. Already, Thiruvananthapuram, Kochi, and Kozhikode had been given these ambulances as part of the corporate social responsibility (CSR) activities of Cochin Refineries. Police personnel trained in first aid and emergency evacuation would be deployed in these ambulances, he added.

Plea to amend rules

Meanwhile, the Transport Commissioner, also the State Road Safety Commissioner, has written to the Transport Department to amend rules to ensure that speed restrictions are not applicable to ambulances.

As per the Central Motor Vehicles Act, ambulances are exempted from speed restrictions when they carry the critically injured. The Transport Commissioner is seeking amendment to the Kerala Motor Vehicle Rules as the State Police Chief has directed the police to book speeding ambulances following a recent incident in Kollam.

The Transport Commissioner has also issued a directive asking officials of the Motor Vehicles Department not to book ambulances that rush the injured even if they violate speed restrictions, sources said.

Flights for vision

The documentary *Hospital in the Sky*, starring model and brand ambassador for OMEGA, Cindy Crawford, shines a light on the life-changing treatments the Orbis performs.

When earlier this year I read about a documentary called *Hospital in the Sky*, my curiosity was piqued. Was this a metaphor for something? I soon found out that it was quite literally an eye hospital aboard a plane, which travels the world to treat patients. This specially-converted jumbo jet is called Orbis' Flying Eye Hospital. It is a fully-equipped mobile ophthalmic hospital as well as a teaching facility. The documentary is an eye-opener and the narrator is the Swiss watch brand OMEGA's ambassador Cindy Crawford, who talks about how Orbis' flying hospital was set up in 1982 and has travelled to 92 countries helping over 23 million lives. This film is a 48-minute joint production between OMEGA and Orbis and it chronicles model Crawford and her daughter Kaia's day aboard the Flying Eye Hospital in Trujillo, Peru.

Orbis is a large international charity dedi-

ing and training doctors, nurses and bio-medical engineers in the skills needed to save sight. The Orbis Flying Eye Hospital is the result of a unique convergence of medical and aviation industries. Once the people at Orbis realised that the high costs of tuition, international travel and accommodations prevented most doctors and nurses in developing countries from participating in overseas training programmes, they built a system where the treatment and the knowledge went to the patients and doctors, alike. So what made a luxury watch brand like OMEGA get involved in a project like this? "The nature of our support is twofold: we make a financial contribution that is linked to the sales of certain watches while we use our international reputation to raise awareness about what Orbis is doing to change lives around the world. We have learned from our friends at Orbis that the vast majority of blindness on Earth is preventable or treatable. Knowing that motivates us to do all we can to help the organisation and to raise its profile," says Stephen Urquhart, President of OMEGA.

Away from the bright lights of catwalks and fashion events, Crawford found herself trading her red-carpet looks for a hospital scrub. When asked about the experience in an email interview, she says, "I have had the opportunity to take part in a number of amazing things over the years, but my recent trip to Peru to see firsthand the work that the Orbis does on the Flying Eye Hospital was definitely a highlight, and the fact that Kaia was there with me to share the experience made it even more special." While on the outside, the plane is like any other aircraft, the inside is like no other. It hosts an ophthalmic hospital and teaching facility right on board. The aircraft is also specifically designed to land in difficult conditions and is self-sufficient.

Orbis visits developing countries and focusses on helping people with limited access to advanced surgical procedures. "I've always been aware of the fact that people living in developing countries face different challenges than those who live in more developed areas of the world. Standing alongside Orbis' medical professionals as they treated their patients made me more aware of the prevalence of preventable blindness and how devastating impaired vision can be for people in all walks of life no matter where they live," says Crawford. The plane has a laser room and its two main functions are examining patients before and after surgery and performing laser surgery. Unlike surgery performed in a standard operation theatre, laser surgery does not require a sterile environment. There's no need to open up living tissue, so there is no risk of infection. Some of the instruments are equipped with cameras, so trainees in the classroom can see the view from inside the microscope. Much of this equipment is fitted with second eyepieces so two doctors can examine the patient, simultaneously. The room also contains an EYESI simulator for intraocular surgery. The view through the EYESI microscope is similar to the familiar stereovision through the surgical microscope and allows the user to experience intraocular surgery realistically outside the operating room. The operating room is strategically located in the

most stable part of the aircraft — in line with the wings of the plane. There are five cameras in the room that generate large close-up shots of the procedure as well as overall wide shots of the operations. The floor and ceilings of the room have been reinforced to accommodate heavy equipment, which is either stored or strapped down during flight. The sub-sterile room is equipped with scrub sinks that provide water that is potable, filtered through a 12-step process involving charcoal, UV light and chemical compound filters. The recovery room is equipped with three beds and monitors and a crash cart for emergencies. The area is also used for training local nurses in patient care.

So where do the students and trainees gather to observe and learn first-hand various surgical procedures?

The Orbis aircraft has a 48-seat classroom in the front of the plane where local healthcare professionals can come together for discussions and live broadcast of surgical procedures being conducted in the operating room on the aircraft. They can observe, learn and ask questions to the operating surgeons via a two-way audio-visual system. Seeing first-hand the work of the Orbis hospital was definitely a once-in-a-lifetime experience for Crawford herself. "It would be difficult to pick just one or two moments from the trip that are more memorable than others. Witnessing the life-changing work that the Orbis volunteers do and being there when children who had been treated onboard the Flying Eye Hospital opened their eyes and could see was so meaningful. It's an experience I'll treasure for the rest of my life," she says.

In 2013, the Orbis visited India for the fourth time and worked out of a base in Kolkata. More recently, the plane visited Vietnam, offering the locals much-needed aid. The plane is flown by volunteer pilots who take medical professionals on board the state-of-the-art airplane to developing countries. What's more, medical volunteers donate time and transfer their expertise, knowledge skills and help build eye-care platforms for the future.

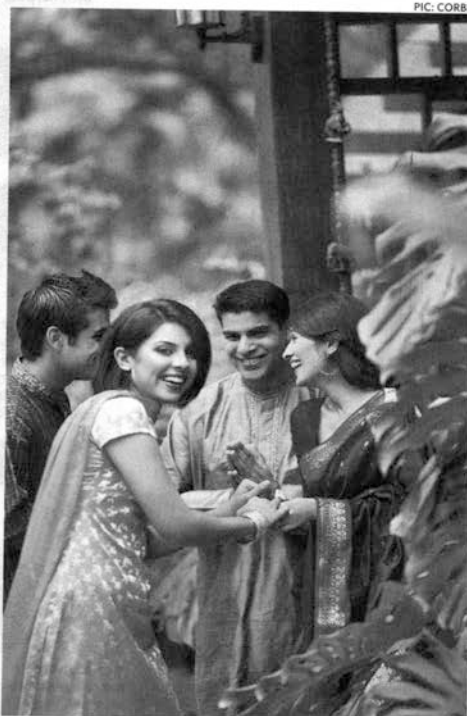
Finding that still place within you, and other ways to emotionally detox this festive season...

Since 2005, Direct Relief, an American nonprofit organization, has been donating medicines and medical supplies at free of charge to Meenakshi Mission Hospital and Research Centre (MMHRC) for its free patient care activities. The mission of Direct Relief is "Improve the health and lives of people affected by poverty or emergency situation by mobilizing and providing essential medical resources needed for their care". Meenakshi Mission Hospital and Research Centre address the health issues of needy patients, effectively covering its mission "World class care within everybody's reach" into action in collaboration with Direct Relief. MMHRC has been implementing different health care projects among target beneficiaries in Tamil Nadu in this connection. Direct Relief is donating in kind and grant as per the emerging situation such as diseases outbreak, natural calamity etc. In support of Direct Relief, MMHRC has been appropriately addressing health needs of the victims.

Free Patient care services:

At MMHRC we treat all patients without any discrimination of caste, creed, gender, race, religion etc. Those who are not affordable for treatment due to the poverty also taken cared for. Since the medicines, medical consumables and equipments are costly, the hospital often decides to bear the expenses and treat the patients. In this critical juncture, the in kind donations like medicines, medical consumables and medical equipments from Direct Relief enhance MMHRC's efforts to serve the poor and needy patients. The support from Direct Relief is received under Indo US Bilateral agreement and charity section. Quality medicines for various purposes, which are approved by US Federal Drug Administration, WHO, UNICEF and United State Pharmacopoeia (USP) and produced by world renowned pharmaceutical companies, USA, are received directly through Direct Relief. These medicines help MMHRC to serve the patients free of cost. Occasionally, MMHRC receives medical equipments from Direct Relief. Such donations are used for and by patients of different departments at MMHRC and MMHRC's Satellite – sub centers including MMHRC – Health Centers

located in Pulicate Island, Thiruvallur District located near Satish Dhawan Space Centre Sriharikota Range Satellite Launching Station of Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO). Health camps, Tele-Medicine Centres etc., In addition to the direct use among patients at MMHRC, we also distribute the consignments to patients from Kashmir to Kanyakumari through reputed hospitals. More than 100 charitable hospitals help MMHRC to serve patients across the country. For the past 10 days, MMHRC has been providing free treatment with the support of Direct Relief, USA.

Direct Relief partnership enhances and encourages MMHRC to scale up its free patient care programs. MMHRC has a standard storage facility and man-power as specified.

Medical Relief among Tsunami Victims:

On Sunday, 26th December 2004, the devastating tidal waves that lashed several coastal districts to Tamil Nadu killed thousands of people and left lakhs wounded from Kanyakumari to Pulicate. After just 20 minutes of Tsunami killer waves, the post tsunami scenario was very much against the survival of the coastal people. Crops, animals, and infrastructures were demolished and washed away. To save the lives from the damage and out-spread of diseases, in collaboration with Direct Relief, MMHRC launched health camps combined with referral services and Trauma counseling. Four teams comprising of medical and paramedical professionals were sent to the affected. MMHRC continuously carried out the health services among the Tsunami victims from 2004 to 2007. The entire coastal belt from Kanyakumari – Muttam to Pulicate Island was covered by the team. Medical supplies and grant were provided by Direct Relief all along three years. MMHRC saved the lives of millions in the post tsunami context.

Mobile CT scan:

To ensure quality diagnostic services combined with treatment at the patients doorsteps, Direct Relief donated a mobile CT scan. Dr.N.Sethuraman and Dr.S.Gurushankar received the van in person from the donor at US. The then Governor of Tamil Nadu Dr.Surjit Singh Barnala received the unit at Raj Bhavan.

Tele-Medicine:

Tele-medicine unit, an innovative program which ensures medical facilities at the door steps of victims in time of natural disaster. In collaboration with Direct Relief, MMHRC has developed a state-of-art tele-medicine unit. The unit is equipped with appropriate equipments and professionals to move place to place and treat the patients in emergencies. The bandwidth connectivity via satellite from ISRO further ensures the accessibility of medical technology in remote areas and provide emergency medical care. For the past ten years MMHRC has been using the tele –medicine unit visits the village based mini tele-medicine units located at different villages in and around Madurai. Supportive health delivery backup initiatives are provided, in addition to regular health camps given by mobile telemedicine unit for these village based tele medicine centers. MMHRC has a strong base station at main hospital and coordinates the tele-medicine program from this central hub. The well equipped tele-medicine unit provides hope and much needed medical care for the people in and around Madurai in time of calamities.

Rare Diseases Project

MMHRC plays supportive role with Direct Relief to save the lives of 48 children living with Lysosomal Storage Disorders. The costly medicines not accessible and affordable to the children are imported and made

available to the children in partnership with local health care providers and hospitals. Once in six months about 40 crores worth of medicines are supplied free of cost by Direct Relief to these children living with Lysosomal Storage Disorders.

Direct Relief – MMHRC Health Centers in Pulicat Island:

Direct Relief donated two health centers which are located in Pulicat Island, Near Andhra Pradesh, Thiruvallur District. A team comprising ten qualified medical and Para-medical professionals delivers primary and secondary health care services to the fishermen community residing in 15 hamlets on the island. At these health centers, about 25 to 100 patients are treated every day. MMHRC Health centers are the only hospitals in the island which provide allopathic treatment. In recognition of the noble services of MMHRC among the Pulicat Island dwellers, the Health and Family Welfare Department, Government of Tamil Nadu has issued a Government order to place medical students from Government Stanley Medical College and Hospital, Chennai under internship program. In addition to the health care activities the two health centers are used to train medical students.

Nepal Earthquake:

With 375 of Nepal's 446 public health facilities and 16 of its private facilities destroyed by the recent earthquakes, the highest near-term priorities include the resumption of health services, provision of logistics to provide drugs and supplies, and care for both injured persons and the general population.

With your support, Direct Relief has delivered more than 100 tons of medical aid – of which nearly half arrived thus far at Kathmandu aboard a Direct Relief – chartered airlift – to health facilities in the Country's hardest-hit regions.

These supplies mean that people who were injured in the quake will get the surgery they need because a hospital will have the right surgical materials; that pregnant women will get prenatal vitamins for a healthy pregnancy; and that children born prematurely will breathe on a ventilator – and it's thanks to you and everyone else who responded, acted and contributed in this time of need.

Vitamin Angels is a US based non-profit working with a mission to reach children under-five with essential micronutrients like vitamin A supplements and de-worming tablets. We reached 10.5 million children under-five through partner network of 450 NGOs.

MMHRC is our partner in this mission to ensure that children receive all their essential doses of vitamin A and de-worming. MMHRC extends their support through their expertise in clearance of the product imported, storage at the Madurai warehouse, and shipping of the medicines to our extensive NGO network situated all over India.

Recently when Vitamin Angels wanted to support the Nepal government with vitamin A (through Unicef support), MMHRC helped extensively in getting all the documents and paperwork to initiate an emergency shipment to Nepal. We thank them profusely for their constant and timely support in ensuring that together, we are able to save children's lives by helping reach NGOs with essential medicines.

Emergency Services for Nepal Earthquake Disaster
